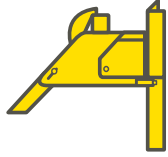


Loading Dock Area Safety Checklist



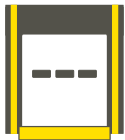
1. Trailer Restraints - Condition & Functionality

- Physical condition is intact – no rust, damage, or missing parts
- Securely engages trailers and RIG Bar
- Visual indicators (red/green or locked/unlocked) are functioning
- Audible alarms (if equipped) are operational
- Wheel Chocks as back up exist



2. Dock Leveler - Operation & Wear

- Smooth operation with no jerking, delays, or abnormal noise
- Lip extends/retracts fully
- Platform is structurally sound; no visible damage
- Hydraulic system (if applicable) shows no leaks
- Toe guards and safety legs are present and undamaged
- Capacity matches utilization (no overloading)
- No deck slip hazards



3. Dock Door & Seals - Integrity & Safety

- Doors open/close evenly without sticking
- Weather seals are intact and effective
- Panels free from dents or cracks
- Motor or manual operation functions normally
- No visible tears or gashes in vinyl components



4. Lighting & Visibility (Interior & Exterior)

- Interior dock lights are functional and properly aimed
- Exterior lights illuminate trailer parking area
- No flickering, dim, or broken bulbs



5. Trailer Stands/Stabilizers

- Available and in good condition
- Used consistently on unrestrained or unsupported trailers
- Ground surface under stabilizers is level and secure



6. Clear Signage & Floor Markings

- Warning signs (pedestrian, forklift, emergency) are visible and undamaged
- Floor markings (safety zones, traffic lanes) are unbroken and clearly visible



7. Integrated Controls (Wayne Dalton or Other)

- Control panel shows normal operation
- Safety interlocks function as designed (leveler won't deploy unless door is open)
- Emergency stop is clearly marked and functional



8. Fans & Electrical Safety

- Circulation fans are clean, mounted securely, and working
- All lights and wires are intact with no fraying or exposure
